

LARSEN HEALTH CENTER RESIDENT VISITATION POLICY

We understand how important visitors are for residents who are residing or recovering from surgery or illness at Larsen Health Center. As a setting where residents live in close proximity to each other, there are certain risks that need to be considered, as well as a balance of each individual resident's right and need to receive visitors with the rights and needs of other residents around them. Please review these important guidelines regarding Larsen Health Center's Resident Visitation Policy:

- Residents are welcome to receive visitors 24 hours a day unless a restriction is placed on visitation by regulation or local authorities, such as the Department of Health.
- Larsen Health Center is secured between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. To gain entry outside this time period, please use the doorbell inside the front entryway.
- All visitors must complete a screening process through the Accushield device located at the First Floor reception desk, to the left of the elevators. The device will print a sticker that must be worn during visits.
- A mask covering both the mouth and the nose must be worn by visitors while in any common areas of the Larsen Health Center, including elevators, hallways, activity rooms, living rooms, lobbies, and dining rooms (except when actively eating or drinking).
- Masks may be removed while in a resident's private room with the permission of the resident.
- Visitors should refrain from visiting if not feeling well, if directly exposed to COVID-19 within the previous five days AND without a negative COVID-19 test on day five, or if they tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 10 days.
- Visitors should perform frequent hand washing or hand sanitizing throughout their visit.
- Visitors must maintain at least six feet of distance from all other residents, visitors and staff.
- Visitors must follow all instructions from staff regarding the health and safety of the resident they are visiting, as well as other residents.
- Any visitor who is disruptive or poses a danger to any resident or staff member may be required to leave Larsen Health Center.

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
